On March 8th, they'll receive a "commitment tag" and write down their commitments on it. Then they can place the tag on their backpack, bag, lanyard tag, or purse, to remember what they committed to for the rest of the series.

WEEK 1 FEBRUARY 9

BOTTOM LINE:

Jesus is before all things!

SCRIPTURE:

Genesis 1:1
John 1:1-3
Colossians 1:15-18

WEEK 2 FEBRUARY 16

BOTTOM LINE:

We were made by God, and for God!

SCRIPTURE:

Colossians 1:18
Matthew 6:25-34

WEEK 3 FEBRUARY 23

BOTTOM LINE:

Jesus paid the price for us!

SCRIPTURE:

Colossians 1:19-20
2 Corinthians 8:1-7
John 3:16

FAMILY TALK:

- Did you know Jesus was there at the creation of the earth?
- What does it mean that Jesus is "before all things"?
- How can we commit to giving Jesus everything?

ACTIVITY:

Make an obstacle course in your house or backyard. Have one person (blindfolded) go through at a time. The rest of the family should tell whoever is blindfolded how to navigate the course. (If an obstacle course doesn't work for your family, then have one person at a time create specific objects out of playdough while blindfolded and following directions from their family.)

TIE IN:

How does it feel not being in charge, and having to follow direction from someone else? This activity was about trust. It's easier to follow someone or something when you know you can trust it. During "ALL IN," ask yourself this question. "Do I really trust Jesus to lead my life?"

FAMILY TALK:

- Jesus is the head of everything. He is the head of the church, of our homes, and of our hearts.
- Focus on Matthew 6:33: What does it mean to seek first the Kingdom of God?
- What are ways we can seek Jesus first as a family?

ACTIVITY:

Play hide-and-seek throughout the house.

TIE IN:

Talk as a family about some of the things that make you worried or stressed. When things worry you, or cause you stress, how can you remember to seek Jesus first? Do you trust that He will take care of you in the end? Remind yourself that if God created the flowers and takes care of them, and you too were created by God and for God, wouldn't He take care of you too? Of course!

FAMILY TALK:

- Discuss what the word "reconcile" means: to restore to friendship or harmony.
- Jesus died on the cross for our sins. John 3:16 reminds us that because of God's great love for us, He GAVE something so precious to Him, His one and only son, Jesus.
- Because of Jesus' sacrifice for us, we can have a relationship with God again. That's cause for celebration!
- Through Jesus' ultimate example of giving, we have the freedom and privilege to give to others as well.

ACTIVITY:

Your CF Kid should have received a "commitment card" explaining what it means to commit. Go over the card and discuss as a family things you can commit to being generous with. Have your kid come prepared on the weekend of March 8th for the CF Kids Commitment weekend. Commitment can look like committing your time, money, resources, etc. Examples can be donating your favorite toy so that others have a chance to have a toy, give away your birthday money to help kids at our global campuses, committing to volunteering more, helping your siblings or parents at home, etc.

TIE IN:

Because of God's great love for us, and because He gave what was most special to Him for us, we can have a heart to give too. Generosity is a fancy way of saying to give plenty with a happy heart. For the next half of "ALL IN," think through how you want to challenge yourself to give more to reflect the heart of God.
